

City of Lakeside Park
Minutes of 6/13/2022
Regular Council Meeting

CALLED TO ORDER:

Mayor Markgraf opened the meeting of the Lakeside Park City Council at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, June 13, 2022. The meeting started with the pledge to the flag led by Mr. Grimes and continued with a prayer by Mr. Wolfer. Those in attendance were Council Members: Mr. Bernheimer, Mr. Grimes, Mrs. Thaman, Mr. Waite and Mr. Gastright was absent. City Attorney Mr. Voss, Mrs. Mueller, and Katie Hehman were also present for the meeting.

Mr. Voss conducted a reading of Municipal Order 3-2022 appointing Courtney Mueller as City Clerk. Mr. Wolfer made the **motion** to approve Order 3-2022. Mr. Bernheimer seconded the **motion**. Voice vote was taken. **4 Ayes, 2 Absent. Motion** carried.

Mayor Markgraf conducted the swearing-in of Mrs. Mueller. Roll call was taken by Mrs. Mueller.

AGENDA:

Mayor Markgraf requested agenda to be amended to include 2nd Reading of Municipal Order # 2-2022 in line item #2. Mr. Wolfer made the **motion** to adopt the agenda present. Mrs. Thaman seconded the **motion**. Voice vote was taken. **4 Ayes, 2 Absent. Motion** carried.

MINUTES:

Council having received copies of the 5/9/22 Council Meeting minutes was asked for any additions or corrections. Mrs. Thaman made the **motion** to adopt the minutes as amended. Mr. Grimes seconded the **motion**. Voice vote was taken. **4 Ayes, 2 Absent. Motion** carried.

CITIZENS ADDRESSING COUNCIL:

Resident on 108 Yancey St. was present for update on parking at Vanderen Dr. and Yancey Rd. intersection. Mayor Markgraf reported yellow paint will be applied on the curb of these problem areas. He and our Public Works, Steven Greer, said this will happen when weather permits.

MAYOR'S REPORT:

Mayor Markgraf read a proclamation for Mrs. Hehman's resignation. Mayor Markgraf invited all Council Members to the Mayor's Group hosted by Lakeside Park on Saturday, June 18, at 9:00 a.m. Mayor Markgraf reminded neighbors to follow the Nuisance Ordinance. He reported to avoid a citation by keeping lawns below 8 inches, leaving grass clippings off streets, sidewalks, and picking up after dogs. He announced a City of Lakeside Park job opening for a Recreation Director.

LEGAL:

Mr. Voss conducted the second reading of Ordinance 2- 2022 Adopting Annual Budget for FY '22-'23. Mr. Bernheimer made a **motion** to adopting Ordinance 2-2022. Mr. Wolfer seconded the **motion**. Roll call was taken **4 Ayes. 2 Absent. Motion** carried.

CITY CLERK/TREASURER'S REPORT:

FIRE/EMS:

The monthly report is in the record book. Chief Adam Fuller reported they had a busy month. They are currently working on the Hero Festival that will be held on the DCCH grounds in September.

PUBLIC WORKS:

Ms. Thaman reported the Paul Hesser project is complete and due to weather N. Ashbrook project is starting the week of June 20, 2022. She reported Geisen St. broken crosswalk will be budgeted, repaired, and painted, but no date has been set. Ms. Thaman announced Street grading has been done and the 5 year report will be discussed at the next public works meeting on July 7, 2022. Pavers, and painting benches are complete at the Veterans Park. Public Works has completed more visible signing for major streets and continues to work on this. PDS continues to work on consolidating Ordinances and making these consistent across the county.

POLICE AUTHORITY:

Mayor Markgraf reviewed the most recent meeting minutes. The monthly report is in the record book and Mayor Markgraf reported 23% came from City of Lakeside Park. Mayor Markgraf reminded residence speeding will be watched on Buttermilk, Dixie Hwy., and Turkeyfoot. He reported officers are actively teaching Active threat trainings and recently held a Family Reconciliation training at Lakeside Christian Church. He would like to thank Lakeside Christian church and their generosity for offering their resources and assistance. Mayor Markgraf wanted to mention the positive reviews reported for the Thomas More Student Police Academy. He thanked SGT. Paolucci for starting this Academy, which has led to an outstanding internship for these students. Mayor Markgraf reported an open position and the department is advertising to fill the opening. Mayor Markgraf wanted to congratulate the police department on their 5th Five Year Accreditation good through 2027. He reported benefit packages are going to be reviewed as he would like to keep all of our qualified Police Officers. Next meeting will be held June 20, 2022 @ 5:30PM.

PDS:

The monthly permits and violations are in the record book. No additional report.

FINANCE:

The monthly report is in the record book. Mr. Grimes highlighted some details for the month of May. The City collected \$229,000 in income with \$179,000 coming from Licenses and permits. total expenses for the month were \$58,000.00. The majority expenses were for Public Safety. The checks all appear to be properly recorded. The total in checking and savings is roughly \$2.8 million.

RECREATION:
