

City of Lakeside Park
Minutes of 8/8/2022
Regular Council Meeting

CALLED TO ORDER:

Mayor Markgraf opened the meeting of the Lakeside Park City Council at 7:00 p.m. on Monday, August 8, 2022. The meeting started with prayer by Mr. Grimes and the pledge to the flag led by Mr. Bernheimer. Those in attendance were Council Members: Mr. Bernheimer, Mr. Wolfer Mr. Grimes, Mr. Waite, Mr. Gastright, and Mrs. Thaman was absent. City Attorney Mr. Voss, Mrs. Mueller, were also present for the meeting.

AGENDA:

Mr. Waite made the **motion** to adopt the agenda present. Mr. Bernheimer seconded the **motion**. Voice vote was taken. **5 Ayes, 1 Absent. Motion** carried.

MINUTES:

Council having received copies of the 7/11/22 Council Meeting minutes was asked for any additions or corrections. Mr. Wolfer made the **motion** to adopt the minutes. Mr. Grimes seconded the **motion**. Voice vote was taken. **5 Ayes, 1 Absent. Motion** carried.

CITIZENS ADDRESSING COUNCIL:

Resident from 2560 Dixie Hwy. requested to keep her storage shed after receiving a citation. Mayor Markgraf made her aware the shed was erected without a permit from the beginning and sheds are not permitted in the City of Lakeside Park.

MAYOR'S REPORT: Mayor Markgraf invited council to attend the next Mayors group meeting on Saturday August 20, 2022@ Elsmere Senior Citizens Center. Mayor Markgraf announced garbage pick up around 6 AM when heat index is above 90 degrees. He thanked Mrs. Schabell for providing a donation event for victims in Eastern KY.

LEGAL:

Mr. Voss conducted a second reading of Ordinance Order 3-2022 amending parking on Hudson.
Mr. Waite made a **motion** to adopting Municipal order 3-2022. Mr. Bernheimer seconded the **motion**. Voice vote was taken. **5Ayes. 1 Absent. Motion** carried.

CITY CLERK/TREASURER'S REPORT:

FIRE/EMS:

The monthly report is in the record book. Chief Adam Fuller reported they had a busy month. They are currently working on the Hero Festival that will be held on the DCCH grounds in October, and he encourages everyone to attend. Chief Fuller reported 6 car seats installed during car safety and Installed 37 smoke detectors in homes for the month. He reported full employment with a New full-time employee Cam Covington. Chief Fuller announced Two firefighters Deployed July 29th – August 2 to the Eastern Ky floods.

PUBLIC WORKS:

Mr. Tom Bernheimer reported Northern Kentucky Water district repaired and will be responsible to maintain the water main break on Penwood/ W. Lakeside. He stated after multiple failed attempts for residents to obey the locust/Penwood stop sign, Public works next step is to purchase a blinking, solar, LED Stop sign. First section on N. Ashbrook is complete. Our 2nd pour on North Ashbrook was started today. Residents will be notified if affected.

POLICE AUTHORITY:

Mayor Markgraf reported the Police Authority meeting was held on July 18, 2022. The department participated in family reunification during active threat training. The department has hired a new officer, Christopher Steward, a retired KY. State Trooper. He announced Col. Schutte was appointed to the Emergency Communications Board. He reminded the public that we will be reviewing the Police Authority compensation packages in order to keep our great officers. Col. Schutte reported the Charity Car Show raised 6500.00 for the Children’s home.

PDS:

The monthly permits and violations are in the record book. The cities participation in the Z21 updating zoning and Ordinances will begin this Wednesday August 10th. Mr. Waite questioned a shadow Box fence listed in permits issued. This will be reviewed further.

FINANCE:

The monthly report is in the record book. Mr. Wolfer highlighted some details for the month of July. \$369,000 American Rescue Plan Act under the Covid Relief Act. 282,000. Leaving us with the Net income of 122,000. The total in checking and savings is roughly \$2.8 million.


